# The City of the Pines.

ITS LOCATION, RAILROADS AND TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS,
LUMBERING INTERESTS, MANUFACTURING FACILITIES AND
ADVANTAGES—ITS MARKETS, AGRICULTURAL SURROUNDINGS AND DEVELOPMENTS—ITS SPORTING AND SANITARY ATTRIBUTES—ITS PUALIC INSTITUTIONS AND
ITS SOCIAL, RELIGIOUS AND EDUCATIONAL PRIVILIGES—A SKETCH OF ITS COMMERCIAL IMPORTANCE, RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENTS.

### LOCATION.

RAINERD, poetically called "the City of the Pines," finds its location at the junction of three of the greatest highways of travel and commerce in North America, the Northern Pacific railroad system, the Mississippi river and the St. Paul, Minneapolis & Manitoba railway.


Geographically, it occupies a position at the exact center of the State of Minnesota. It is about equi distant from the cities of St. Paul, Minneapolis and \( \preceq Duluth \); the west-

ern gateway for the commerce of the great lakes, and Fargo and Moorhead, the metropolis and distributing center for the Red River Valley. It has from its location no competing intermediate point of importance, and possesses all those necessary climatic and sanitary requirements which have made the northwest so desirable an inheritance. Above it stretches two hundred miles of navigable river, penetrating the solitude of the great pine and hard wood forests. Westward fifty miles away, lie the great prairie regions reaching far out to the Rocky mountains while to the south and southwest, Southern Minnesota, Iowa, Kansas and Nebraska chained to it with iron bands, find in it a common center. The city is built upon a level plateau, fifty-five feet above the river, has excellent drainage, is supplied with an abundance of pure water, is protected from severe winds by the surrounding forests, is an extremely healthy city and has unsurpassed social, religious and educational advantages, which, with its commercial, manufacturing and agricultural resources, all combine to make its location extremely desirable for business or residence purposes.

### RAILROAD AND TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES.

First in order as its first acquisition comes, the Northern Pacific. This great trans-continental line extending from Lake Superior to Puget Sound, with its network of branches and feeders, covering northern Minnesota and Dakota, finds its central operating and repair headquarters at Brainerd. Its main line extending from Duluth due westerly across Minnesota and Dakota, reaches Brainerd, where it crosses the Mississippi in one hundered and four-

teen miles. It was completed to this point in 1870, from which date the existence of Brainerd began. Crossing the river, one hundred and thirty-eight miles brings the road to Fargo and Moorhead, upon the Red River of the North. Southeasterly a branch to Minneapolis and St. Paul one hundred and thirty-eight miles in length gives connection with those great centers and with the net work of northwestern railways which center there. Forty-nine miles west of Brainerd the Northern Pacific, Fergus and Black Hills division, one hundred and nineteen miles in length. parallels the main line through the fertile districts of Montana and Dakota. One hundred and twelve miles west of Brainerd the Manitoba division, two hundred miles in length runs down the Red River Valley to Pembina, at the National boundary line. Thirty-one miles south on the St. Paul division, the Little Falls and Dakota division. another parallel line south of the Black Hills division extends southwest to Morris, eighty miles. The Wisconsin division from Northern Pacific Junction, (ninety-one miles east of Brainerd) to Ashland, eighty-six miles, with the Superior Short Line, nine miles in length, a grand total of 889 miles, gives some idea of the territory covered by the Northern Pacific system east of Fargo, and of which Brainerd is the natural repair and principal operating center. Of the divisions named above, the Wisconsin, Duluth and Superior Short Line, Minnesota Eastern, Minnesota Western, Fergus and Black Hills, and the Duluth and Manitoba are operated from Brainerd, with N. D. Root as superintendent. Besides the divisions named, all Dakota and Montana divisions east of Livingston (the next repair shops of any importance on the line west of Brainerd) are tributary to the Brainerd shops for any repairs in the freight car and locomotive department. The road runs three daily express trains each way through Brainerd, connecting with all branch line trains and at St. Paul and Minneapolis with all eastern, southern and southwestern roads. It practically gives to the city six separate lines of road within its own system, opens the door to the markets of the world and gives access to a scope of country replete with all classes of natural resources and large enough to form a state of no mean proportions.

#### ST. PAUL, MINNEAPOLIS & MANITOBA.


The early arrival of what is to be the future main trunk line of this great system between its eastern terminal point at St. Paul, and Manitoba, Montana and the Pacific, is a fixed certainty at Brainerd. The section to be built as soon as spring opens is from Millaca via. Brainerd, and Leech Lake to connections with its line now building southeast from Crookston. The survey made has been most elaborate, and not only shortens the distance very materially between Crookston and St. Paul, but furnishes a grade far superior to that of any competing line. The completion of this section will not only place Brainerd upon a second great trans-continental line of freight and travel, but will connect the city with all the St. Paul, Minneapolis & Manitoba railway system. It gives it two routes to St. Paul and the east and south, two lines to Duluth, with its lake transit, and furnishes direct communication with double the scope of country now available to it. The importance of this new railroad connection to Brainerd or the effect which it will have upon its future can hardly be over-estimated.

#### RIVER TRANSPORTATION.

For two hundred miles above Brainerd the Mississippi takes its tortuous course through the great forests of pine and hard woods, where the lumbermen are engaged each winter. The current is not rapid and the stage of water uniformly good for the whole of the distance. A fleet of river steamers will be put on the coming season between Brainerd and Grand Rapids which will convey the enormous amount of supplies annually consumed by the lumbermen and their teams, to points on the river. A good local trade is already being done by the boats and the development of the fine country along the river is rapidly assuming proportions.

### BRAINERD'S LUMBERING INTERESTS.

Next to the railroads, and the earliest to follow it, was the lumbering interest. The vast forests of pine and hard wood which cover about one-fourth of the area of Minnesota, are at least three-fourths of them located upon the Mississippi river and its tributaries. Between St. Paul and Brainerd, the Falls of St. Anthony, Sauk Rapids, Little Falls and other obstructions prevented the free navigation of this section of the river. Prior to the building of the Northern Pacific, the St. Croix and the tributaries of the Mississippi below here, furnished the lumber supply of Minnesota. The distance over land was too great to permit the hauling of supplies by team, so but little, if any lumbering was done above Brainerd. With the building of the Northern Pacific to the Mississippi, crossing at Brainerd, a giant industry sprang into existence, which



made its supply center there, and which is to-day one of the greatest of which it can boast. To this point annually, come thousands of men with their necessary teams and accoutriments to engage in the cutting and rafting of logs. Provisions and supplies for this vast army of men and teams comes to Brainerd by rail, where during the late fall months it can be shipped to depots of supplies along the river by boat. Of pine alone from three to five hundred million feet of logs are cut annually, and are floated to this city and to points beyond. A large number of those employed and operating in this great industry have their homes in Brainerd, and add to its wealth and population. At Brainerd logs destined for the mills at Minneapolis or intermediate points, pass into the control of the Minneapolis Log and Boom Company, whose boom limits extend from that city to the foot of the Brainerd dam. The boomage afforded by the improvements recently made by the Mississippi Water Power and Boom Company at this city is sufficient for 3,000,000,000 feet of logs, which is practically free and offers an added stimulus to this industry. The amount already cut in the past eighteen years, seems not to have lessened the supply, and when (if ever) this shall begin to fail, the supply of hard wood and of other soft woods such as poplar, cedar, basswood and soft elm exists even in the pine area in vast and inexhaustable quantities. As vet, but little hard wood timber has been cut, this branch of lumbering having been seemingly neglected, yet, with oak, ash, elm, maple, butternut, poplar and basswood of the very best character, for lumber and for manufacturing purposes so abundant and easy of access, will ere long come to rival the pine interests in extent and value. Another important feature and one which will render the manufacture of lumber more profitable at Brainerd than at Minneapolis or other points lower down is the fact that here the sawing season is always from four to six weeks earlier. The delay occasioned in running logs to Minneapolis consumes this time while at Brainerd, as soon as the ice is gone logs begin to come into the boom. This advantage is one which will readily be seen and appreciated by lumbermen, and mill owners.

#### MANUFACTURING INTERESTS.

The primary element necessary for the development of these interests is power. Man has sought out many inventions to supply this want, but none of them compare in point of cost, durability and reliability to that furnished by the great creator. The great river with its never failing volume of water, its high and abrupt banks and its natural fall furnish in themselves this latter force of nature, and when developed (as they have been of late here) form such a power as might serve to turn the machinery of an empire.

MISSISSIPPI RIVER WATERPOWER AND BOOM COMPANY.

This corporation organized at Brainerd a few years ago, has made substantial improvements, and now has the best water power and boomage ground on the river. Their work consists of a dam across the Mississippi just north of the city. It affords the enormous amount of twenty-five thousand horse power, controls if necessary the whole flow of the river, and has twenty feet of head. Its

construction is a triumph of engineering skill, and has been conducted on scientific principles, regardless of cost. At its point of location the river is just 270 feet wide with high abrupt banks of from 65 to 90 feet. The bed of the river is a solid clay formation into which rows of oak piling were driven 7 feet apart, extending across the river, and 100 feet up and down stream. Upon this piling, sawed off two feet below low water mark, and the interceses filled with rock, were laid the timbers, which from the frame of the dam fastened securely by means of heavy drift bolts. Next a double row of sheet piling was driven above the dam, and with its wings extending a long distance into each bank, and slanting up stream. Upon this massive foundation the superstructure of the dam progressed, each section and each timber being drift bolted to the solid mass, and every atom of space filled with rock. In its building there were used 2,500,000 feet of pine, 70,000 of oak, 80 tons of iron and 2,800 cords of stone. But further means were used to make this gigantic mass, knit together with all the skill science could direct, and art supply, an impregnable barrier to all the force of the rushing flood of the great river. Above the dam a solid bank of earth has been graded in from the side of the floom to the opposite bank and extending one hundred feet above the dam. This mass of earth rises to within two feet of the top of the dam with a sloaping bank up stream, and most effectually relieves it from the pressure of the vast body of water above.

#### THE FLOOM.

This is built in the most substantial manner, and is 60 feet wide by 200 feet in length, and has five gates of the

heaviest and most massive pattern. A sluiceway fifty feet wide, has been provided, through which logs are to be permitted to go over the dam which is protected by an apron extending to the lower edge of the foundation. The dam throughout, was built under the personal supervision of the president of the company, not one hour of contract labor having been performed. It is simply built to stay, and stay, it will so long as the everlasting hills shall stand.


#### ITS UTILITY.

The utility of this great power now ready for use (and comparatively free) for manufacturing purposes can at once be seen. Any industry requiring motive power no matter how great, can here be supplied at a nominal cost. The company, who own the adjacent frontage, are most liberal in their offers and inducements and can supply to all, location, power and other necessary adjuncts. Its enormous and safe boomage offers particular inducements for the manufacture of lumber, and mill-men are sure to take advantage of it. The large supply of all varieties of hard wood near at hand and unrivalled in quality, makes the opportunity for the manufacture of farm implements of every kind and variety, extremely good. Wagon and carriage factories, hub, spoke and felloe factories and stave mills, furniture factories, turned goods mills and in fact any kind of wood working industry where unlimited power and an abundance of the raw material can be had close at hand are particularly adapted to Brainerd. With Duluth so close by, with its great iron supply, manufactories of mixed wood and iron goods can also be desirably located here. The two great railroad systems

mentioned, alone could take, at a fair profit to the producer, who has his cheap power and cheap and unsurpassed raw material, all the cars that any one factory could manufacture annually. The sash, door and blind factories coming in the wake of the sawmills could find no better point at which to locate.

#### FLOURING MILLS.

To this branch of manufacture Brainerd also offers extraordinary advantages. It gives cheap power and provides cheap material for barrels. Its two great lines of road with their feeders and branches reaching out

into the heart of the best wheat-growing section in the universe, gives the means of a limitless supply of the finest of grain. On both lines can this wheat be "milled in transit" from the wheat fields of western Minnesota, Dakota and Manitoba, and the product be laid down at Duluth as cheaply as the grain can be drawn to Minneapolis.

#### PULP MILLS.

But there is still another branch of manufacture which seems especially adapted to a location at Brainerd and that is the manufacture of pulp. The abundance of poplar and other comparatively worthless soft woods, and the ease with which they can be obtained and floated to the very spot desired, presents the strongest possible inducement for the establishment of one or more of these mills here. In short there is no branch of manufacture, scarcely, where cheap location, cheap power, cheap raw material and good markets close at hand, are objects worthy of consideration, to which Brainerd does not to-day offer unrivalled advantages.

#### PRESENT DEVELOPMENTS.

The development of manufacturing enterprises at Brainerd forms no inconsiderable factor in her present growth and business prosperity. Aside from her railroad and lumbering interests the support of the business of the city is derived from its manufacturing concerns.

### NORTHERN PACIFIC SHOPS.

The first manufacturing establishment of any extent to be inaugerated at this city was the Northern Pacific shops. They are the largest and most complete of any similar works in Minnesota. While nominally intended for use as repair shops for the freight and locomotive departments, they still have the capacity for complete construction and a new locomotive of the best pattern and design could be turned out on short order. They are the

principal repair shops east of Livingston, M. T., and have virtually the locomotives and freight rolling stock of 2,000 miles of road to keep in repair. The works have a capacity for the employment of 1,200 men, 630 now being upon the rolls. The buildings are located in what is known as East Brainerd, about three-fourths of a mile east of the railroad bridge, on both sides of the main line track to Duluth. They consist first of the

#### OFFICE BUILDING AND STOREHOUSE

This structure is of brick, two stories in height, with slate roof, 43x282 feet in extent and which is located just south of the main track. In this building are the offices of the Master Mechanic, Master Car Builder, Draftsman and Clerks' offices, a large and nicely furnished Free Reading Room, and telegraph and storekeepers offices on the ground floor.

Second comes the Boiler and Tin shop, 80x224, also brick with slate roof and fire proof. Third the Machine and Erecting shop 120x244, fire proof like the rest. In this shop all iron and steel work is done and here the locomotives are repaired and fitted for the road. From the south end of this building projects an annex 40x80 feet containing the engine and boiler rooms; the former a mammoth Corliss fed by a battery of six large boilers, and possessing some 1,500 horse power. Third, just east of the Machine shop is the Round House, 316 feet in diameter and containing stalls for 44 engines. Fourth, south of the Round House is the Blacksmith shop, 80x197 feet, built of brick with slate roof like the others. In this building the forging both heavy and light is done. Fifth, east of

this group, and still south of the main track are the Iron and Coal storehouses, the former 26x57 and the latter 26x98. Sixth, the Oil House located south of the track and west of all the buildings named, is 45x62, and like the rest fire proof. It is two stories high and contains six huge tanks on either floor, those on the lower floor having a

capacity of 18,000 gallons each, while those on the second floor hold each 12,000 gallons. Immense steam pumps are used to convey the oil from the cars to the different tanks. The buildings south of the track are devoted to locomotive repair works. North of the Duluth main tracκ lie the buildings belonging to the

#### CAR DEPARTMENT.

These are devoted at present to freight equipment exclusively. The Paint Shop, frame building 50x240 lies north and east of the office. The Foundery 80x235 with an annex 33x16 devoted to Brass Founding, and one 21x43 for Engine and Boiler room. A Cleaning room for cleaning old castings 33x46. Cupola room 21x36 and four Core rooms all connected under one roof, makes a perfect bee hive of industry. This establishment is at present under lease to Parker & Topping, but the larger part of their work, and in fact nearly all of it is done for the railroad company. West of the Foundery is the Pattern Storehouse 40x60 where all the patterns for iron and brass castings for locomotives and cars are kept. Next in the car department comes the Wood Working shop. 65x160, with an annex 40x65, used as an iron shop for axle work and car wheel boring. The second floor of the Wood shop is used as a pattern shop where the wood patterns for car and locomotive castings are made. North of the Wood Shop is the Office building, for the Master Car Builder and Clerks, while still north of this is the Freight Car Repair Shop, 80x160, and west of this is the Lumber Dry Kiln 40x70 feet. The entire plant is valued at over \$2,000,000, and is admirably arranged and under the most systematic management. The entire yard is protected from fire by frequent hydrants, and has hose and other fire apparatus close at hand, with a well organized fire department. Some idea of the relation these works bear to the business prosperity of the city, can be obtained from the fact that the monthly pay roll of the shops and the N. P. R. R. operating department here amounts to over \$60,000. Payments are made by means of checks on the First National Bank of Brainerd and are made as regularly as the fifteenth of every month comes round.

#### J. J. HOWE & CO.

Next to the N. P. Shops the most important manufacturing establishment at Brainerd is the saw mill of J. J. Howe & Company. It is located one mile below the railroad bridge, where the company have boomage for 2,500,000 feet of logs. The mill has two rotary saws, shingle and lath saws and a separate shingle mill, which cuts shingle from the log as taken from the river. The capacity of the plant, at ten hours per day, is 90,000 feet of lumber, 150,000 shingle and 30.000 lath. A planing mill with three planers, a siding and splitting machine and a dry kiln with two stalls and a capacity for drying at the rate of 25,000 feet per day, are located at the upper end of the yard. The company also have a machine shop containing iron planer, drill, lathe and other necessary adjuncts and do their own machine repairing. The mill has an engine of 250 horse power to drive it, while one of 150 is used to operate the planer. A dynamo for their electric ligat plant is also in position so that a night force can be used about the mills, yard or boom. The company manufacture from 15,000,000 to 25,000,000 feet of logs annually all of which is piled in their vard and shipped by rail. During 1887, 1,200 cars of their product were shipped or an average of 100 cars per month. The company wholesale to jobbers and dealers and run yards of their own in various portions of Minnesota and Dakota. They own large tracts of pine timber and log very heavily

themselves, buying logs occasionally of outsiders. In their mills, yard, boom, office and in the woods in the winter they furnish employment to some 150 men the year round.

#### WHITE & DAVIS MILL.

This mill, located just north of the railroad track on the west side of the river, has an annual capacity of 3,000,000 feet of lumber. It has good boomage facilities, and the product is available for shipment on the Northern Pacific, and will also be within easy reach of the Manitoba road. The mill of L. P. White, south of the city, has a capacity of 1,000,000 feet per annum, the entire product of which is sold from his yard in the city for local use.

#### BRAINERD MANUFACTURING CO.

This institution, located at the foot of Oak street, in a building 56x80 feet, has a 40 horse power engine for its motive power, and is a joint sash door and blind factory and feed mill. It has a capacity of four tons of feed per hour, and fifteen men find constant employment, the whole year round. The wood department is furnished with modern and improved machinery, and turns out excellent work which finds ready local sale. The product of other sash, door and blind factories is very much needed to go with the lumber product of the mills.

#### BRICK.

The manufacture of brick, is one of the most important industries of the city, and has absolutely no limit. The clay which exists in inexhaustable quantities, is of a su-

perior quality. Both red and cream brick are made, and the substantial character of the buildings which have been already built, testifies as to their utility and importance in the future of Brainerd. But not only as an indispensible article for home use does this industry take its importance, but, as an article of export, it has already assumed large proportions. Duluth, the cities of St. Paul and Minneapolis and intermediate points are already drawing largely for their supply from here, while west and southwest the demand begins to come. During the past year over 11,000,000 brick were manufactured here, and preparations for an increased manufacture the coming year are being made. The Brainerd Steam Brick Yards located near the dam, made 7,500,000 cream brick last year, while L. P. White and the Brainerd Brick Co., each, made 2,000,000 red brick. The fine fire-proof shop buildings of the Northern Pacific R. R. company here, are built of Brainerd cream brick, while Duluth and the twin cities begin to show many fine structures of the same material. With the increased transportation facilities, which the Manitoba and other roads will bring, and the addition of tributary territory, the brick industry of Brainerd in the future, will become one of the largest and most productive which the city possesses.

### MARKET FACILITIES.

In close connection to its present and prospective manufacturing interests, the question of "markets" bears a very important relation to the prosperity of Brainerd. First as to its lumber supply. The enormous prairie wastes, utterly devoid of timber south and west of the great timber region of which Brainerd is the center, do now, and will for all

future time look thither for their supply. The Northern Pacific alone furnishes 2,000 miles of road over which to distribute the lumber product of this city which will be doubled in extent as soon as the Manitoba arrives. At St. Paul and Minneapolis, connections are made with the vast system of roads which extend their net work of tracks all over Southern Minnesota, Iowa, Kansas, Nebraska and Southern Dakota. Besides this, direct air line connections with Huron, Sioux Falls and other southwestern points is being rapidly sought, and ere long direct transit on a half dozen or more independent lines will enable the lumber shipper at Brainerd to get direct, rapid and cheap transit to any portion of the great country to the southwest, which has had for so long a time to pay tribute to Chicago. The wheat producing section of the great Northnest is determined to seek its market at Duluth, and the cars which bring the wheat in will take the lumber back. What is true of the lumber interests is also true of all other lines of manufacture that may become located here. The farming implements of the country must come from the wood and iron districts. One to two thousand miles of freight saved to the purchasers is no small object, and to be next door neighbor to the consumer as Brainerd is to the great agricultural region of the Northwest, is the most perfect guarantee of a reliable and profitable market.

#### AGRICULTURE.

The soil in the vicinity of Brainerd is a yellow sandy loam with clay subsoil which retains moisture to a wonderful extent in the dryest seasons. The contour of the land is such as to preclude the idea of too much wet land the rolling surface, frequent natural water courses and ravines affording ample facilities for drainage. While along the Mississippi the country is heavily timbered, there are frequent bits of open prairie and light oak openings or "bush prairies" as they are called further back. There are also vast natural meadows of blue joint and red top which are the most rich and nutritious either as summer pasturage or for winter forage when cut and cured. From Jane until snow flies the having season lasts, the earlier frosts having no visible effect upon the grasses which seem to cure upon the stalk. It is also a well watered country. Its numerous lakes, frequent springs and sparkling brooks furnish the purest and best sources of nature's indispensable fluid and combined make it a most desirable stock country. The various crops usual to this latitude flourish here. Vegetables of all kinds seem indigenous to the soil, mature rapidly, attain a wonderful size and are of the most exceptional excellence. Wheat, oats, early varieties of Indian corn, rye, barley and in fact all the small grains do remarkably well and yield abundant harvests. But beyond all other inducements for the encouragement of agriculture in this section is that of a most renumerative home market. For every bushel of vegetables or of any farm grains or produce, every pound of poultry, pork or beef, every ox, horse or cow raised or brought to this market, there is invariably an excellent cash demand. The large

number of men engaged in railroading, in lumbering or manufacturing who produce absolutely nothing must be fed. Teams, oxen and horses must be had for the great logging camps, and these latter always bring a large price. From one, to two hundred and fifty dollars, for a yoke of

oxen, and from one, to three hundred dollars, for a horse are fixed prices. From four to six thousand men must be fed during the logging and driving season, which lasts from October to July, and thus vegetables and food for

stock command the very best fall and winter market. A mixed system of farming combining grain, vegetables, stock raising and dairying has also been very profitable here, and those who have engaged in these pursuits have done well. There is no government land in the near vicinity of Brainerd, but good farming lands can be had for from five to twenty dollars per acre combining timber, water, meadow and fine farming lands. The farmer on the western praries finds stock raising impossible. He must burrow up during the winter, consume the fruits of his summer's work in fuel and food for his stock, and has from four to six months of the year of time that is absolutely wasted. In this section, sheltered from the fierce blizzards, his stock comfortably housed in barns that have cost him nothing but his own labor, with abundant stores of the richest cured grasses, and water close at hand, the farmer has no trouble to winter. His fuel costs him nothing but his own labor, and while the prairie farmer is fretting himself to death over his enforced idleness, the farmer of this section if he has no pine timber close at hand either cuts cord wood, ties, fence posts or telegraph poles, which he banks on the river or railroad track, and from which he derives a most bountiful revenue. Not an hour of enforced idleness does he see. Everything he raises finds in this city of wage workers a most renumerative market, and whatever labor he engages in, turns to ready money and fair profit in his hand. Practical agriculturalists are fast finding this out, and as a result new farms are being opened up with great rapidity. There are no mortgages to fret and worry over and the industrious and economical farmers are fast becoming independent.

#### SPORTING FACILITIES.

To the sportsman and tourist, the vicinity of Brainerd offers the most enticing charmes. Nature has here been most profligate in her distribution of gifts. It is the finest timbered country under the sun, is the best supplied with pure water, has the most numerous and picturesque lakes and has a variety and excellence of game and fish to be found in no other section. The charming bits of lake scenery shown in this work afford a glimpse of this elysian, this sportsman's paradise, which must be seen to be realized. Beautiful lakes well stocked with fish of the choicest kinds can be found within a half hours walk of the city while in every direction from four to ten miles drive, will bring the pleasure seeker to some lovely sheet of water where he may indulge his taste for acquatic sports to the utmost. So the woods too, for the hunter offer rarest sport. In the winter he may if he choose, find deer in abundence, moose and carriboo if he have the nerve and endurance to follow them, and fowl and smaller game, and even bear in the proper season.

#### AS A HEALTH RESORT.

As a natural consequence where nature has been so lavish of her gifts a most excellent sanitary condition exists at Brainerd. A pure and abundent water supply, excellent drainage, a dry clear atmosphere, and a climate free from the terrific blizzards of the same latitude further west, renders it healthful. No malaria exists here, and thus far no serious epidemic or contageous disease has ever been recorded. The pine forests fill the air with that balsamic odor so agreeable and helpful to pulmonary diseases,

while ague and fevers cannot exist. Many of the beautiful lakes with which Brainerd is environed have been improved by the building of cottages upon their banks, and by supplying fleets of row and sail boats so that the invalid, the worn and weary business man, or the pleasure loving one of leisure, may find health, quiet and blissful pleasure at their own sweet will. The sporting facilities and sanitary conditions of Brainerd and vicinity are not among its least attractions.

#### PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS.

The business, social, educational and religious institutions and privileges of Brainerd are far in advance of its sister cities of like age and population, and commend it to the world as a most desirable location for business or residence purposes. The city government has always been conducted on a most liberal and broad gauged plan, which has placed it far in the lead. It has one of the best and most effective fire departments in the west. It has the finest water works immaginable, a thorough sewerage system covering the business portion of the city and being rapidly extended to the residence portion, has its streets lighted by the arc electric light while the incandescent system is to be extended to the entire residence portion at once, has a street railway in successfull operation on over a mile and a half of track and has schools, churches and all social, religious and educational institutions that are desirable or necessary in a city of ten thousand people. Some of the more important public institutions, will now be briefly noticed.

#### CHURCHES.

Brainerd has eight church edifices, some of which are indeed elegant structures. They are Congregational, Catholic, Baptist, Episcopal, Methodist, Norwegian Lutheran, Swedish Baptist and Swedish Lutheran. In addition to these the Y. M. C. A. people who have a very

strong organization here are at present erecting a chapel in the public park opposite the N. P. railroad in which regular services will be maintained. The religious sentiment of the city will compare favorably with that of any city of equal population and it can be said of each church organization that it is in a healthful and growing state.


#### SCHOOLS.

The public school system of Brainerd is in a most excellent state of discipline and efficiency. There are five school buildings as follows: High school building, First ward building, Second ward building, Third ward building and West Brainerd building. Of these the High school building (a cut of which will be found in this work is a most elegant structure, and compares favorably with any similar building in the state. The high school department which has been for two years past, in the state high school course has at present, 35 pupils, while 700 and over were enrolled in the city schools last year. The attendance is fully up to the minnimum of other cities, and the record of advancement shows the school work to be in charge of competent persons. The school year consists of nine months. The high school is furnished with very good chemical and philosopical apparatus, and an excellent library. In addition to the public schools of the city, is a large Catholic Parochial school, which is also in a flourishing state.

#### N. P. SANITARIUM.

The Northern Pacific Beneficial Association which has its general headquarters at St. Paul, is an organization of which every employee of the Northern Pacific Rail Road Company is a member. It is supported by an enforced tax levied pro-rata as follows upon them. Men whose pay is \$100 per month or less contribute 50 cents per month, one hundred, \$1.00 per month, and over \$200 two dollars per month. At Missoula, on the western end of the road, a smaller Sanitarium is located, while at

Brainerd is a large and roomy structure designed for the use of all its lines and branches from St. Paul to Helena. It is a long three story building situated upon the west bank of the river and adjoining the N. P. R. R. track and possesses in every sense the necessary sanitary requirments, so far as pure water, excellent drainage and

perfect ventilation are concerned. The building is heated throughout by steam, and kept at a uniform temperature. It has a capacity for 70 patients who are comfortably cared for and provided with nurses and medical attendance free of charge. Patients who are employees of the road and prefer to remain at their homes, are allowed fifty cents per day and free medicine and medical attendance while confined to their rooms. The Sanitarium receives pay patients who are not attacked with contageous diseases when not over crowded. The institution is a

blessing to the railroad men, and is fully appreciated by them. A cut of the Sanitarium at Brainerd will be found on the opposite page.


#### COURT HOUSE.

The Crow Wing County Court House is located on the west half of the block bounded by Main, Kingwood, Fourth and Fifth. It is built of Brainerd cream brick, is fire proof, and a model of beautiful architecture of which any city might well feel proud. It contains a large and airy court room with adjoining jury rooms on the second floor, while upon the first floor are spacious offices for the Clerk of Court, Judge of Probate, and County Surveyor, Register of Deeds, Auditor and Treasurer. Comodious fire proof vaults protect the valuable county books and records. Cass County, upon the other side of the Mississippi as yet unorganized, is attached to Crow Wing for judical purposes, and her records are also kept here. A jail and sheriffs' residence, also built of cream brick, the former containing steel lined cages is located upon the county property just south of the Court House.

#### SLEEPER'S OPERA HOUSE.

This structure, one of the finest places of amusement in the state outside the metropolitan cities, located on 8th street, between Front and Laurel. It is built of Brainerd red brick, is 62x125 feet in extent and 65 feet high. The auditorium, capable of seating 1,000 people, is on the ground floor and is easily and quickly emptied of the largest crowds. The stage and orchestra occupies a space 40x60 and so well arranged is its interior that all seats

have a free and unobstructed view of the stage. It is furnished with a more than usually large amount of scenery and all necessary stage settings and properties, while fine opera chairs fill the auditorium. The second floor con-

taining a suite of ten rooms is arranged for masonic use, where, Commandary, Chapter and Blue lodge hold their meetings, and which they have nicely furnished. Cuts of the Opera House, Sanitarium, Congregational church,

Commercial Hotel, High School, First National Bank block and the McFadden and Westfall block will appear in this work.

#### FIRST NATIONAL BANK.

The fine two story cream brick block at the corner of 6th and W. Front streets, is the property of the First National Bank, and one of the finest business blocks in the city, a cut of which appears in this work. The bank is the oldest, and at present the only National bank in the city. It has an authorized capital of \$200,000 of which \$50,000 has already been paid in. The bank has a present surplus of \$30,000 and does a very large business. The Northern Pacific Rail Road people pay off their help by checks on this bank while J. J. Howe & Co., and many other leading business houses of the city transact their business through it. It is one of the foremost business institutions of the city, and enjoys the confidence not only of the people of Brainerd, but of the commercial world in general.

The "Lumbermans Exchange" a private banking institution located on 6th street in the Bank block, also comes in for a share of the business of the city.

#### THE PRESS.

Brainerd has one daily and four weekly papers which are fully up to the standard of western journals, and have been able allies of every public enterprise, and to such invariably they have lent the force and weight which well conducted and ably edited journals always possess. To them the citizens of the "City of the Pines" owe much of their present prosperity.

#### THE DAILY NEWS.

The youngest of them all is a sprightly six column folio edited and published by A. Dewey, every week day afternoon. It is "Independent" in politics with a leaning toward the republican side if anything, and carries "Tariff for revenue only" at its masthead. It was established June 6th, 1887, and owns both the "Western Associated Press" and "American Press Association" franchises for Brainerd. It has a mechanical outfit excelled by no newspaper in the northwest, outside of the Metropolltan dailies, both as to its newspaper and job department. It has a fine cylinder press, with steam as the motive power, and is an institution of which any city of its size might well feel proud. Its weekly issue, just double the size of its daily, is published every Wednesday, and is sent by mail at \$1.00 yer year. The daily by carrier or mail is \$6.00 per vear, or 50 cts per month. Office, Cor. 4th and W. Front.

#### THE BRAINERD TRIBUNE.

This is the oldest newspaper at Brainerd, and is published every Saturday, Halsted & Pennell proprietors. It is a seven column quarto, and furnishes more reading matter with each issue than any of its contemporaries. It is ably edited, and is a good local sheet. It is printed upon its own cylinder press, and also has a good job outfit, especial attention always being given to the job department by the junior partner of the concern, who is a

thorough practical printer. It is a rock ribbed republican newspaper, and its subcription price is \$2.00 per year. Its office is in the Hartby block W. Front street.

#### THE BRAINERD DISPATCH.

Messrs Ingersol & Weiland, two young practical printers own and edit this paper, of which they became possessed some four years ago. It is a nine column folio, and is published every Friday, and is republican in politics. It is printed upon its own cylinder press, and has a fine job office in connection. The Dispatch is thoroughy a local paper, and keeps pace with the growth and development of its city. Its subscription price is \$2.00 per year. Office in Sleeper's block.


#### THE WEEKLY JOURNAL.

This, also a nine column folio is the sole exponent of democracy among its city contemparies, and is owned and published by H. C. Stivers Thursday being his day of issue. This is a purely newspaper office, having no job printing department. It enjoys a very healthy patronage, and is especially regarded as the friend of the laboring man. Its subscription price is also \$2.00 per year. Office in Sleeper's block.

#### MERCANTILE INTERESTS.

While Brainerd has not as yet reached out to any extent in the department of wholesale merchandising to adjoining cities and towns, yet in the matter of lumbermens' supplies, a large jobbing business has been done for a number of years. Her resident lumbermen find it more profitable and convenient to procure their supplies as fast as needed at their own door than to import them





from other points. Lumbermen also who operate in this vicinity, but whose homes are elsewhere, find it very convenient to load their teams with necessary supplies as necessity may dictate, and send them without delay to camp, or to forward by boat before the lumbering season begins. Large capital, and a thorough knowledge of the needs and requirements of this class of people are both necessary to meet this demand, and hence it has followed that nearly all the business houses whose lines embrace those articles which the lumberman must have, are to a greater or less extent engaged in wholsaling. particularly true of the grocery dealers who carry large stocks of feed for the use of the teams, and of meats both fresh and salt, for the use of the men. It is not an uncommon thing for those engaged in this supply trade to sell as high as a quarter of million of dollars worth of goods in a single season. In the retail trade too great enterprise is shown, and no branch or department of business exists anywhere in a city of ten thousand people which is not well and perfectly represented here. In many instances the elegance and profusion of the display and the fine furnishings and fittings, spacious quarters and modern conveniences to be found in the Brainerd retail. stores are a marvel of wonder to the beholder. The retail. trade of the city enjoys a good patronage, and those engaged in it are very generally quoted high in commercial circles and have capacity to meet all the requirements of an ever increasing trade.

#### BRAINERD FIRE DEPARTMENT.


The Brainerd fire department is a thoroughly organized and very efficient institution. Its water supply is fur-

nished by the Brainerd Water company which have 72 hydrants for use for fire purposes and which furnishes the necessary pressure for use therefor, by means of the "Holly" system. The water supply is so abundant that not a wooden building within fire limits under ordinary circumstances is permitted to burn down. The efficient chief is one of the principal officers in the State Firemen's association and is a thoroughly experienced and practical fireman. The department is entirely a volunteer one and numbers 150 men, devided into four hose and a hook and ladder company. The central fire station is located in the heart of the busine portion of the city at which two hose companies and the hook and ladder company are located, while the other two hose companies are located one in East and the other in Southeast Brainerd. The department have 2,500 feet of the best  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inch hose with  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch nozzles, four hose carts and a fully equipped hook and ladder truck. They have an electric fire alarm system and each one of the five companies which compose the organization are in a most perfect state of discipline and efficiency. The value of such an efficient department to the manufacturer or the business man cannot be over estimated and will readily be seen.

#### BRAINERD CITY BAND.

This institution now composed of twenty-two members and of which the city feels very justly proud, was organized Jan. 21st, 1872, and has maintained its organization intact since that period, earning a reputation for excellence unrivaled by any other similar organization in the state, outside of St. Paul and Minneapolis, in which cities they

have always been received with favor. At the Detroit tournament, in July, 1884, they took the first prize, their leader, Wm. M. Dreskell, being also awarded the first premium as cornet soloist. Prof. Dreskell also has a fine

orchestra in connection with the band and furnishes music for the Opera House and all public and private balls and entertainments.

#### BOARD OF TRADE.

The Board of Trade of the city of Brainerd is an institution which embraces nearly all the business men of the city and is a thoroughly live and energetic body. It was organized in March, 1882, and has, by its prompt and decisive action at critical periods, helped very much to advance the interests of the city. It is at present in a most prosperous state. Its meetings are well attended and the united wisdom and practical business experience of a class of men, who, drawn as they are from various sections of the country and thus possessed of a wide and varied knowledge of the many difficult business problems, is brought to bear upon its deliberations. To this harmonious union of gentlemen who compose the board and whose concerted action upon all questions of public importance can always be relied upon, does the future commercial importance of Brainerd very largely depend.

#### CO. K. THIRD REGT. M. N. G.

A company of State Militia with the above title and assignment were organized in the spring of 1887, at Brainerd, and on June 25th of that year were mustered into the service of the State of Minnesota. They number at present forty-three officers and men, and have a spacious Armory on West Front street, where they hold semimonthly drills, the non-commissioned officers having an evening school on the two alternate weeks, one evening each week The company is in a good state of drill and discipline, and is one of the institutions of the city.

#### CIVIC SOCIETIES.

The Civic Societies of Brainerd form quite an interesting feature in its social system. Nearly all of the leading societies usually found in western cities and towns are represented here and have strong and effective organizations. The Masonic fraternity are perhaps the most important and have a commandery, chapter and blue lodges. They have splendid apartments built expressly for their accommodation in the Opera House block, upon the floor above the auditorium. Here they have a fine lodge room, banqueting hall, kitchen and complete suite of necessary apartments which are occupied exclusively by them. The Odd Fellows, who have an encampment and two subordinate lodges, own their own block on South Sixth street, the street floor being occupied for mercantile purposes,

while their spacious hall has the second. The three lodges named occupy it while other societies rent from them, the hall being in constant use. The railroad employes have four societies; Order of Railway Conductors, Branch of Locomotive Engineers, Branch of Locomotive Firemen and Branch of Railway Brakemen. Besides, there are the North Star, a Scandinavian society; a German Musical Society, Royal Adelphia, Knights of Honor,

Knights of Pythias, Knights of Labor, Ancient Order of Hibernians, a post of the Grand Army of the Republic and a company of Sons of Veterans. Numerous as these societies are, they are all well supported and ina healthy condition. There are also the usual number of church and religious societies.

## CONCLUSION.

In concluding the descriptive department of this work, 1 may crave the indulgence of its patrons if I recapitulate some of the more striking features which have been noticed during its compilation and which combine to make Brainerd one of the most desirable business and residence locations in all of this great and enterprising Northwest. First its location in the exact center of this state, and its contiguity to the great timbered and prarie regions of the great Northwest, give it especial advantages as a great distributing center for the products of the forest, the soil or the factory. Second, the great systems of railroads already in operation and others in process of construction, and its river transportation give it easy access to all parts of the country. Third, its mammoth and unequaled water power and enormous and safe boomage facilities give it unsurpassed advantages as a manufacturing center. Fourth, its excellent market facilities, and its proximity to such vast and rapidly increasing armies of consumers must present unsurpassed attractions to producers in every department of business. Fifth, its surrounding country, rich in productive capacity and easy of acquirement, offers the agriculturalist and stock raiser the most superior advantages. Sixth, its sanitary business, social, educational, moral and religious status is of such an incomparable character as to invite all classes to its borders, and to guarantee to all as much of business success, health and happiness as can be hoped for in few localities and exceeded in none. With a class of business men and citizens always keen and alive to public interests and improvements, helpful and obliging to one another, and possessed of all those necessary elements which make business successful and life [a pleasure, it is easy to conjecture that the future of Brainerd will be still more encouraging and progressive than its past. It is easy to conceive of a city of twenty thousand to take the place of the present city of ten, and that the fair and goodly heritage which its people now possess will always attract the brains, intelligence and wealth of the country.
