**Tuesday, Oct. 8.**

The newspaper has been extended to Philadelphia and the Press has been started.

One hundred tons of rock from the new, near, Longmeadow, yielded \$1,000 in gold and silver bullion.

Work on the Erie Canal at the Falls of the Genesee has begun, and it is expected to have everything under way by the end of the month.

Out of 1,194,142 males in the world, 650,000 are above the age of 15, 450,000 white and 200,000 colored.

The commissioner of patents has decided that silverware is not a new invention, but a mere improvement upon the ironware already in use.

The Houston & Texas Central railway has informed the governor of this state that as soon as possible separate cars will be provided for colored people.

**Wednesday, Oct. 9.**

At Liverpool, England, Catherine Fitzgerald carried on a business of selling fire insurance on the lives of those she knew and then poisoning them and collecting the insurance money.

There are 2,000 cases of yellow fever and other contagious diseases in Mexico; at Manzanillo the people are dying by hundreds and the local physicians have done much damage in Vera Cruz that a famine is feared.

Five to the depth of from three to five inches fell in the states between North Dakota, Nebraska, and Oregon, Wyoming, the greatest fall being at Denver.

Delia P. N. Brown, of New, sends out an appeal to the people of the Grand State for every contribution to the fund for the sufferers by the earthquake at Lehigh.

The steamer Hong Kong came away from San Francisco nearly twice loaded (Chinese). Each had full complement of crew, three-fourths of them carried return certificates.

An oration was given to Gen. Butler in Faneuil hall, Boston, on the occasion of the opening of the campaign. The speaker said that if his enemies choose him enough they will elevate him to a very high office.

The National Bankers' association elected Loren J. Gray, of New York, president. Resolutions were adopted favoring an equitable business law and recommending a discontinuance of the monetary expansion of silver dollars.
