John W. Garrett, president of the Baltimore and Ohio Railway Company since 1886, died at Old Park, Md., on Friday aged sixty-five years.

The wife of Dr. Decker, the much advertised slight-of-hand doctor, now at Minneapolis, ran away from him last Friday night, taking among other things all her jewelry, \$800 in cash and a \$500 seal ring.

Gov. Hubbard received an official document Monday from Grover Cleveland of New York, recommending the withdrawal of Wall Street New York city, for resident commissioner of streets for Minnesota in that metropolis.

The Mississippi river at Quincy Ill., has been fast along low lands mark and still rapidly raising. The annual rainfall at this season of the year occasions the great fears on the lowlands, where immense damage will be done unless the flood subsides.

The employers of Oliver Bros. & Phillips, iron manufacturers at Pittsburg, have been notified of a general collection in wages, 12 per cent. The continued depression in trade, shrinkage of the values of all products and competition are assigned as the causes.

The deputy sheriff of Fargo and Officer George Casey arrived at St. Paul, on Tuesday night, with two crazy men on their way to Yakima. At Kasota one of the lunatics ran away from the station, and was not found until Thursday morning, when Officer Casey came across him in the State county.

Minnesota leads the country in the amount of track laid during the nine months of the present year, the total number of miles being 529. The amount laid in Dakota was 112 miles. These figures do not include mileage put in operation, but only the track actually laid since Dec. 31.

The farmers of that section are generally satisfied with these prices, have decided to accept a proposition of Van Dusen & Co., to buy and operate the company's elevators for the season, paying one cent per bushel for wheat stored in or passing through the elevator. Thomas A. Hendricks, when a senator of the United States, denied the right of congress or the people to abolish slavery by constitutionally enacted votes against the thirteenth, fourteenth, and fifteenth amendments to the constitution. He supported in the Senate a proposition depriving every colored man of his vote unless he owned at least \$250 in property in his own right or that of his wife. He opposed the restriction measure by which the various states were brought back into the union, and before the repeal of the fugitive slave law. In Indiana he discouraged enthusiasm against the draft and gave encouragement to the knights of the golden circle.

A frightful accident happened on the Omaha railway Thursday near Bayfield, Wis., a construction train going through a bridge. The train was loaded with poles and accompanied by twenty-two men, all told. Left Washburn after dinner to retrace a washout one-half mile south of this point. This train was running at about fifteen miles an hour, when it struck a washout just north of the Pike creek bridge, and the engine and tender plunged headlong into it.
