Mr. Brainin was not at the mill at the time of the fire, but he was informed of the disaster by a messenger who arrived at his home at about 12 o'clock.

Mr. Brainin immediately telephoned to the fire department and requested that they send a fire engine to the mill.

The fire department responded immediately and a fire engine arrived at the mill at about 12:30 o'clock.
