The prisoners confined in the jail at St. Cloud have been transferred to Little Falls while new steel cages are put in at the former place.

The government has directed Agent Shuler to expend \$2,000 in goods and provisions for the poor Indians on the Mille Lacs reservation.

The house committee on Indian affairs at Washington on Tuesday authorized a favorable report on the bill introduced in the house introduced by Mr. Casselock, granting the right of way to the Little Falls, Mille Lacs & Lake Superior through the land occupied by the Mille Lacs Indians in Minnesota.

Don't Want Free Trade. A special from Ottawa, Ont., under date of Feb. 26th, says: In the house of commons yesterday Mr. McMillan, of Huron, proposed the following resolution: That it is expedient to remove the duty on and place on the free list all grains and seeds which do not ripen in Canada but which are now largely imported and sown for the production of food for cattle under the system of feeding, called soiling and ensilage, now largely adopted by the farmers of Canada.

Lead Cate by the Tom. The extensive fertilizing firm of Stevenson & Co., of Liverpool, says a London letter, have received a consignment of 10 tons of cate, which is to be used as manure. The cargo contains less than 100,000 specimens of the false species, supposed to have been buried 2,000 years before Christ in an embankment cemetery about 100 miles from Cairo, into which an Egyptian fellah was accidentally precipitated. They were found in rows one on top of the other, carefully embalmed as though they were Egyptian mummies, and were sold in Egypt at the rate of \$13 per ton.

No Extensive Steal. Deputy United States Marshal George Campbell, who has been investigating the reported stealing of pine timber on the northern borders of Minnesota, near Bay Lake, by lumbermen without permits on the United States stumpage, has returned to White Earth, with the posse of Indian police, who accompanied him on the expedition. The deputy marshal says that timber stealing has been going on in this locality for some years, but not so extensively as reported. Most of the lumbermen are Canucks, and claim that they have a right to the timber growing on the Indian reservation because their wives are English. It was also learned that the whisky traffic conducted here to an alarming extent, the Canucks trading off their liquor for Indian furs.

The Intention Defeated. President Harrison has discovered a flaw in the act under which the Citizenship commission secured signatures at the various Minnesota reservations last summer which will prevent him from taking any action looking to the opening of the lands for settlement. The president says a Washington dispatch Tuesday and Congress and Congressmen have returned to the view, setting forth the fact that any Indian may take his allotment on the reservation where he now resides, and that the real content, placed in the act. The president says he is surprised so that the Indian may make his selection. Indian allotments will be surveyed so that the lands are surveyed. This provision defeats the intention of the bill. Senator Sherman thinks that it would be a good thing to gather the Indians in one place where the schools could be maintained and an agent stationed there. Both the senator and Johnston are searching for a way out of the difficulty.

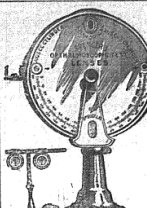
