SCARLES AND PAINE DISCHARGED.

After a Tenuous Examination of Three Days the Court Decides that There is not Evidence Sufficient to Warrant their Detention.

The Decision Reverses the Approval of Every Honest-Minded Person in the City.

At noon on Wednesday of last week Charles Scarles and Wm. Paine walked forth from the court room free men. Their examination on the serious charge of having robbed the Northern Express Company of \$15,000 in April, 1889, the details of which were given in our report, was begun on Monday morning in the municipal court, but no record was made of the proceedings, who were summoned to listen to the evidence, that tender in regard to the safety of the building compelled the adjournment to the court house where the proceedings were taken up at 1 o'clock.

Lawyer Wellington, of St. Paul, assisted by Messrs. McLaughlin and Trus, of this city, conducted the defense. County Attorney Lum and G. R. Arnold, prosecuting on behalf of the state. 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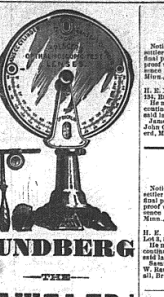
