False Rumor Corrected.
The old adage that a comfortable falsehood will run a mile before plain truth can draw on its heels, is well illustrated in the false rumors attributed to be circulated by my brother, H. T. It is true my brother is addicted to pills of protracted intoxication and intemperate excess, for which he has been several times arrested and imprisoned. It is a provable fact, by recent official and direct testimony, that when his property was destroyed at Gull River he was not and had been in Brainerd for several days, and was in Brainerd when the telegram reached Brainerd, a few minutes after the fire started.

In the case of every fire which has destroyed property in Brainerd within the past four months, with two exceptions, my brother was undergoing sentence of imprisonment for drunk offense, provable facts which I state, humiliating as they may be, in order to disprove and correct the defamatory and damaging lies and statements being made and already alluded to for the purpose of prejudicing the public against him.

Further I state and defy truthful contradiction of the fact, that at the time every fire occurred, both in Brainerd and at Gull River, my brother's actual location so stated that any connection in fact whatever by him with the starting of the fires was simply a physical impossibility.

I have to my satisfaction and that of my friends, thoroughly investigated the circumstances upon which the present accusation is based, and I have no doubts of my brother's innocence, and I shall therefore sustain him in making a defense to the charge made, and I respectfully ask, at least, a suspension of public judgment until both sides are heard before a deliberative court.
