A Reply to Mr. Fleming. At the meeting of the Citizens' League, February 27th, I noticed an article written by Mr. A. Fleming, and am glad to know that he concedes that railroad lands are not to be taxed if they can be. I am not a lawyer and do not know the law, but in a discussion of the matter to my great regret, the editor of the Dispatch above referred to, the honorable member bases his objection to the present mode of taxation on a contract which cannot be annulled or rescinded by the state.

Let us examine a little and see if it is a contract. Brainerd, Feb. 26, 1891.

Annual report of Archbishop Speers, Missionary for American Sunday School Union, for the year 1890.

During the year I have organized and re-organized 45 Sunday Schools, with 200 officers and 1140 scholars, total 1388. Visited and otherwise aided 27 other schools, with 935 teachers and scholars, besides visited a number of denominational schools, have distributed 104 Bibles and Testaments, sold and distributed 1202 worth of Bibles, and 1070 family visits, traveled 8272 miles, delivered 362 sermons and addresses, spent 50 days in evangelistic work, about one-half of the time holding two meetings a day, spent 60 days of the time in my own district.

These services I have done by day, night, and in every part of my field, where I have visited 108 other fields, where over 50 persons professed Christianity.

My district is a frontier, most all wild, timber, with lake, swamps, and prairie, and is a very large one.

The people in some parts are very poor, and live principally by fishing, and making in the timber during the winter.

My people have stood some odd nights tied to a log or the end of an old building. Sometimes I got back beds and hard board, but brass the Lord it is better than my blessed old bedding, at times not getting to my bed.

I have had some fearful sicknesses getting through mules and swamps, and some of the people were almost lost, but when I see for my labor and God honored in the salvation of souls, I feel much comfort for my labor and toil. In one of my school houses we held meetings for two months, all attended, were converted, and many professions, and they have returned their lives, and at the last morning all who attended, and a short time ago on Sunday, I stopped over night with a man that was seeking Salvation, talked with him concerning his mind, and way of Faith, and he came into Liberty. Next morning I called to see another man, who had not come to the meetings and three days later he was home, but I read God's word and prayed with his wife, who had not come out. On my return I met her husband, took him to the bush and kneeling down on the snow prayer, and urged him to do so, and he was converted. The following day he and his wife and wife are at the meetings and three days later I could give many interesting incidents of my work, but do not wish to occupy too much of your time.
