Wanted - An Idea

There are some people who do not know that there is a stringent law regarding the expenses of every candidate for office, whether successful or not, and that every person who was up for office at the recent election must return a sworn statement of his expenses to the secretary of state.

The expenses of candidates are limited as follows: For 5000 voters not over \$2000; for 10000 voters not over \$3000; for 15000 voters not over \$4000; for 20000 voters not over \$5000. The expenses are defined by the act as follows:

For personal traveling expenses, \$500 per day for the candidate and his family.

For printing and distribution of lists of candidates, sample ballots, hand-papers, pamphlets, posters, etc., \$1000 per day for the candidate and his family.

For copying and distributing of political notices, \$500 per day for the candidate and his family.

For postage, telegraph service, etc., \$500 per day for the candidate and his family.

For conveying injured or disabled voters to polls, \$500 per day for the candidate and his family.
