Brainerd Labor Conditions Fine. Mr. Julius Meresh, of Duluth, assistant state factor inspector was in the city yesterday on a tour of inspection. He pronounced the Brainerd shops very fine ones, and said the conditions there were very much superior to similar shops in the state. He reported 475 men employed at the mill and a little over 600 in the shops, and between eleven and twelve hundred men engaged in shop, mill and factory in Brainerd.

Jim's Got Enough. Editor Bell of the Keweenaw Times recently sent a letter to Fred Hill of the Great Northern road, enclosing a printed slip showing the need and the possibly profitable investment of a railroad into that section of the state. In reply Mr. Hill writes:

"The business of our lines in Minnesota, if it were not for the business brought from the western lines would not be sufficient to pay the legal rate of interest on the investment and pay the taxes. Our Minnesota taxes amount to over \$200,000 per annum which, added to the unfriendly feeling throughout the state and country in the northern portion of it, against any railroad enterprise, that we do not feel disposed to build any more railroads in Northern Minnesota. We are building a line this year from Fosston through to Superior, and while for many years I have been little else than to build railroads into new communities, the present attitude of the public is such that I do not care to spend any further time or effort to spend it in vain. Possibly they can get somebody else to do it better."
