The great obstacle that Mr. Bryan has to overcome in his campaign is that in 1892 he predicted that we would become paupers if we did not have free trade, and in 1896 he predicted that the country would be ruined if we did not have free silver. Though he has fanned the air twice, he wants another strike at the ball, says the Austin Register.

GRAND JURORS people are up in arms over the commutation of the death sentence of George Ferguson, of politics away all kinds of evidence against John Lind and his fellow members of the pardoning board. Ferguson was sentenced to hang for the murders of William Noble, a logging companion, and the date for his execution had been fixed for Oct. 27.

FROM six to ten thousand men will be busy the coming year cutting timber in the northern part of the state, and before the season is over 300,000,000 feet of logs will be cut. This traffic will add its quota to the business activity and prosperity of this state, and its beneficial effects will be felt by a large portion of the people through the next year, particularly in the Sixth congressional district. It is a difficult task for C. A. Towne and John Lind to make the people there believe they are not well off and need free silver at the rate of 16 to 1 to make them happy, says the Albert Lea Tribune.

McKinley Was Pleased.

E. C. Blanchard, superintendent of Lake Superior division of the Northern Pacific road, who accompanied the presidential party on its trip over that line from Duluth to Fargo, is much pleased with the compliments that the road received through him as its representative on that occasion says the News-Tribune.

President McKinley told Mr. Blanchard that the trip from Duluth to Fargo was one of the most comfortable runs that he had experienced since starting on the Northwestern tour.

The train left Duluth two hours late and 25 minutes more were knocked off the regular schedule by stops at various places, which occupied more time than was expected. But the train went into Fargo five minutes ahead of the scheduled time, and had been allowed for this part of the president's journey. The train traveled at a rate of 45 to 50 miles an hour. Mr. Blanchard says that of the 10,000 people Brainerd fully 9,000 were at the depot to see the president.

If we had come here one year sooner, things might have been different. California is a lovely place for those who are not afraid of the sun. The last eight weeks of Mr. Holmes' life were spent down at my father's. About a week before he died we took him up to see our new house. 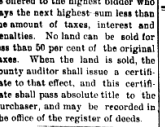
Alfalfa in the Yakima Valley. Alfalfa was known more than two thousand years ago. The Greeks and Romans greatly appreciated its merits, and since that time it has increased in value, until now, it is almost a necessity and is raised in every part of the world where it is possible for it to thrive. At the time of the Spanish conquest it was introduced into Mexico, thence into South America, Chili, and in 1854 California and Washington made its acquaintance. The climate and soil in the Yakima valley, Washington, are especially adapted for the successful growing of this plant, closely allied to the clover family as it is, but serving as a finer fodder. One of the most attractive features of the Yakima, from April to December, inclusive, is the beautiful, dark, rich green of the alfalfa fields. Five dollars an acre will usually cover the cost of seedling, while it is sold at \$5.00 for seed and \$2.00 when baled, and as the atmosphere is so dry and warm, barns are unnecessary for storage. If after each cutting, the fields are irrigated, a crop of from two to three tons per acre may be harvested every six weeks during the summer. Usually it is so arranged that a sixty acre field can keep a haying outfit busy during the entire season, as one part of the field will be in blossom while another is being cut, and still another part growing up. The cause of this rapid succession of crops is that the roots grow to be several inches in circumference, and sink to a depth of twenty-five feet or more. Some almost fabulous tales are told of miners coming across old alfalfa roots which have supposedly extended downwards hundreds of feet. Nevertheless, alfalfa, of recent its rapid growth, and the small cost of originally starting a field and ever afterwards harvesting from the first seedling, has become one of the most popular, if not the most popular branch of farming in the great and fertile Yakima Valley.
