

LAKE SUPERIOR.
The greatest length of Lake Superior is 400 miles; breadth 150 miles; length of coast line 1,700 miles; discharge at outlet, 90,738 cubic feet per second; temperature of surface water in summer, 50° to 55°; deepest sounding, 1,914 feet; elevation above the sea 600 feet.

The resources of this great inland ocean and of the vast unsettled regions lying on its shores are yet almost unknown. Its fisheries alone would give employment to and support thousands of population. Only within the last few years have any attempts been made to develop the minerals so profusely found in all the surrounding country. Belts of the finest timber in the world extend in every direction. It cannot be many years before the rapid march of improvements shall have filled all this region of country with a busy and a happy population.

This, from the Springfield Republican, for the benefit of church members who like to dance:

DEEPEST WELL IN THE WORLD.—At about twenty miles from Brainerd is situated the village of Sprenburg, noted for the deepest well that has ever been sunk. Owing to the presence of gypsum in the locality, which is at a short distance from the capital, it occurred to the government authorities in charge of the mines to obtain a supply of rock salt. With this end in view the sinking of a shaft or well sixteen inches in diameter was commenced some five years ago, and at a depth of 280 feet the salt was reached. The boring was continued to the further depth of 560 feet, the diameter of the bore being reduced to about thirteen inches. The operations were subsequently prosecuted by the aid of steam, until a depth of 4,104 feet was attained. At this point the boring was discontinued, the borer still in the salt deposit, which thus exhibits the enormous thickness of 3,907 feet.
