A reporter of the New York Herald was at Nelly Grant's wedding. He did it by blacking his hands and face, and bribing a waiter to give him his place. Such is Eastern enterprise.

Gen. Custer has returned to Fort Lincoln from his scout after the hostile Cheyennes. He followed their trail for eighty miles, and found that they were moving toward the Black Hills, and that none of the frontier posts of Dakota were threatened by them.

The brewers of the country are holding a National Congress at Boston. From statistics read there it appears that a million barrels more of fermented liquors were used in the United States during the past year than there were during the preceding year, which is an indication that the taste for lager beer is becoming more general.

Negotiation seem to be pending for a renewal of the reciprocity treaty with Canada.

Some scandal having got abroad in Brooklyn, N. Y., in regard to mixed classes in the public schools, a committee of the Board of Education has investigated the matter. The committee does not think it prudent to publish the result of its labors, but recommends the Board to abolish the system of co-education of the sexes. The report was adopted, and mixed classes in the public schools will be discontinued.

It is a wise and thoughtful thing—that which is being done by Congress on Mr. Dannel's motion—to provide that the settlers in six counties in Minnesota, may maintain the titles to their farms, while they may be compelled to be absent, on account of the grasshopper plague, which renders these lands uninhabitable. The limit fixed by the bill is the first of July, 1875, until which time the settlers can be absent without vitiating the titles to their homesteads.

Senator Wisdom yesterday called up in the Senate his resolution appropriating \$200,000 for the survey of the four great lines of water communication recommended by the Committee on Transportation. The resolution gave rise to considerable debate, and while no definite action was reached, the indications are that the resolution will pass. The debate shows that Senators are strongly impressed in favor of the committee's report, and would vote for the improvement suggested if the proper surveys were completed. Members of Congress feel that the whole country is keenly alive to the cheap transportation question, and there is little fear of their going home without taking the initiatory steps to secure it.

ORDINANCE NO. 11.—An ordinance to compel the owners of dogs to procure a license, and to prohibit dogs from running at large in the City of Brainerd, until their owners have procured said license and had such dogs registered and numbered.
The Common Council of the City of Brainerd do ordain as follows:
Section 1. The owner or owners of every dog and slat which now is or may hereafter be found within the limits of the City of Brainerd, shall procure a license from the Recorder of said city to keep said dog or slat, and to permit the same to run at large in the City of Brainerd, which license shall be granted to any applicant therefor, upon his paying to the City Treasurer the sum of one dollar for each dog, and two dollars for each slat to be owned and kept by such applicant, and filing with the City Recorder his receipt therefor, and paying to said Recorder the further sum of twenty-five cents as his fee in full for registering and numbering each of said animals and issuing said license.
Section 2. Before the owner of any dog or slat shall permit the same to run at large in said city, he shall, in addition to procuring said license, put a collar on said dog or slat, on which shall be placed, in legible figures, the number of said animal as registered and licensed by the Recorder.
Section 3. It shall be the duty of all police officers of said city to shoot or otherwise destroy every dog or slat which he may find running at large on the streets, alleys or commons of said city without having on its neck said numbered collar mentioned in the preceding Section, and to remove the bodies of all animals so killed as aforesaid, to some place without the limits of the city, or to bury the same, and for said services the police officer shall receive the sum of twenty-five cents for each dog or slat he may so destroy and bury or dispose of, to be paid by the city.
Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 12.—An ordinance to compel all places of business to be shut on Sunday.
The Common Council of the City of Brainerd do ordain as follows:
Section 1. No person or persons shall keep open his shop, store, warehouse, workshop or saloon, for the transaction of business, within the limits of the City of Brainerd on the Lord's Day, commonly called Sunday.
Section 2. The police of this city are hereby instructed to see that the provisions of this ordinance are carried into effect.
Section 3. Any person or persons convicted of a violation of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, nor less than twenty-five dollars.
