LEGISLATURES CAN REGULATE RAILROADS

The Grangers Triumph in the Supreme Court. The U. S. Supreme Court at Washington on the 1st instant decided the long pending cases relative to the power of the legislatures in Illinois, Wisconsin, Iowa and Minnesota to regulate railroad rates.

Peck, et al. vs. The Chicago and Northwestern Railroad Company et al., and Lawrence et al. vs. Paul and others, and the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad Company's appeals from the circuit court in the Western district of Wisconsin.

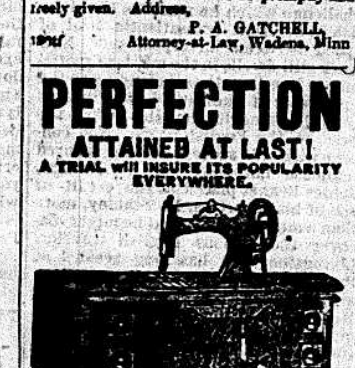
