CURRENT TOPICS.

QUINCY, which is indispensable as a remedy for all diseases which originate in this country, is protected to the extent of \$700,000 a year for the benefit of two firms in Philadelphia, who own the trade, and who are said to have paid \$100,000. This is a billatory conspiracy on legislation and humanity.

No more vivid illustration of the wondrous change of sentiment in this country during the last half century can be found than the fact that William Lloyd Garrison, who was once named in the city of Boston, and whose life was, in fact, threatened in the North as well as in the South, is now mourned by a nation.

It is announced that the authorities of New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania will work in union in the effort to stop the cattle disease. How important it is to curtail this disease can be gathered from the statistics of pleuro-pneumonia in England, where 6,000,000 head of cattle have been lost since 1875, representing a value of about \$100,000,000.
