The Omaha community in New York State has taken a decided step lately toward disintegration. The former organization has been dissolved, and in its place a joint stock company, of \$100,000 capital has been formed. Members who brought as much as \$1,000 to the old association got \$200 in stock, and the rest in cash, and there is a certain allotment to the children. Wages will be paid on the most equitable basis. But the main idea of the Society is gone.

The Catholic Bureau of Indian Missions is receiving last year's accounts. The \$74,000,000, plus \$1,518; but this amount is not supplemented by a small reserve fund, and the support and maintenance of the missions and day schools, with upward of 400 Indian children. The Missions say there are some 80,000 Catholic Indians who are entirely without schools or any other educational advantages on Protestant schools, in which their faith is hourly perilled.
