Persons holding anual passes will be carried on this train, but will be required to pay the extra fares, and must see the second of the control of the cont and must secure extra fare and sleepand must secure extra fare and sleep-ing car tickets before boarding the lim-ited express, except officers and agents of the Pennsylvania Company's lines. Time or trip passes will not be honor-ed. If one person desires to occupy an entire section in a sleening-car he may entire section in a sleeping-car he may do so, provided it can be allowed with-out injustice to the other passengers on out injustice to the other passengers on account of crowded trains, and provid-ed he purchases two first class tickets, and two extra fare and sleeping-car

The Pennsyl-vania neopie acknowledge that their rates are high as compared with the rates charged by the Vanderbilt roads and the Grand Trunk, but they say they are not unreasonably high, con-sidering the accommodations afforded and the extra crosses in the compared to the comsidering the accommodations afforded and the extra expense incurred. The rate to New York by this train, including a double berth in a sleeper, is \$22, which is \$3 less than the rate charged before the present war commenced. The Pennsyivania people think they will catch with this train all the first-class travel—people who do not wish to go on the crawded trains of the roads that charge less rates, and on to go on the crewded/trains of the roads that charge less rates, and on which they are obliged to associate with all sorts of people. The Pennsylvania also expects to get consideration of the pennsylvania also expects to get considerations from people who are crowded for time and wish to get to their destination in the East as quickly as possible.
