The Gravel. The hardest steel is not the most durable for railroads appears from an examination of the work of some of the steel mills on the Great Northern line, England. Seven of the rails, which lay side by side on the road, were taken up and tested, and it was found in one instance that the weight of an inch by traffic amounted to 5,250,000 tons, while a soft rail for the same amount of wear had withstood 8,400,000 tons. In another instance the total was 15,531,000 tons for the hard rail and 83,081,000 tons for the soft rail, the wear being the same—one sixteenth of an inch. Analysts showed this last rail to consist of 90.47 per cent of iron and minute quantities of carbon, phosphorus, silicon, manganese, and arsenic.
