THE SHIRTWADE COLLEGE.

The coroner's jury in the case of the "unfortunate man" died concerning the railway company and employees from all blame, we understand.

FRATERNAL GRIEVANCE.
In an editorial directed against it proposed assurance, the Pioneer Press says: "The proposal to issue \$25,000,000 of fractional currency is one about as inexorably bad as could be devised. Nobody reasonable in the filthy riggered stuff which circulated a few years, without a shudder of disgust. Papers for sale for sums less than \$1 are inadvisable, even in war time. The only conceivable pretext for re-issuing it is the argument of convenience for transferring it by mail. Some sections for sending small sums from point to point would at once be provided, but the \$25,000,000 circulation of fractional currency is a recommendation of Postmaster General Adams, that the issue of every postal order for amounts less than \$5 be authorized, has never been acted upon. Money orders would do all that fractional currency can do and much more. Their chief advantage lies in the fact that every one knows where they are to be found. Suppose \$25,000,000 of shipmasters in circulation, or 50 cents for each inhabitant, and the probabilities are largely against a man who needs to transport a sum to a distance, having the necessary small bills with him, and also against his being able without consideration to obtain them elsewhere. A fractional currency, like a title boy, is always present when it is an annoyance, and absent when it is wanted. Give the people a cheap money order system, and spare them the infliction of more rag currency."
