Sixth Annual Parade.

The boys of the Brainerd Fire Department have things in fine shape for the annual parade which will occur on Wednesday next, the 24th inst. It will be one of the finest and most successful in the history of Brainerd. The department has been organized by Frank, Little Falls and St. Cloud have accepted the invitation to be present and each will be accompanied by their home bands.
