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ANOTHER NEW INDUSTRY.

A Hard Wood Saw Mill to be Constructed Above the Pan This Fall.

"It never rains but it pours" is an old saying, the truth of which has been fully exemplified by the developments in this city during the past few weeks. Last week we had the pleasure of recording two new business enterprises for the development of our city, and this week we have another, the immediate construction of a hard wood saw mill just above the city. The mill will be owned and operated by E. W. Stetson, of this city, who owns a large amount of hard wood stumpage above the city, and has secured the refusal of all the hard wood stumpage of the N. P. Railroad north of here at a figure which would make its manufacture here profitable. He also expects to get all the hard wood stumpage owned by the Northern Mill Co., the logs to be brought here by the several railroads, a very favorable fire rate having already been secured from the new mill company. The mill will not be a large one, containing one circular saw, with a capacity of from 15 to 20 thousand feet of hard wood a day or about 25 thousand feet per week. It will give constant employment, winter and summer, to between 15 and 20 men. While this is not a large enterprise of great magnitude, every little helps. One enterprising bringer of more money than the simple operation of capital it employs or the labor it produces. Mr. Stetson, who is interested in the mill, is a native of this city, and a small mill on the river above here, informed a Dispatch representative that a really market could be found for all the lumber that they could secure, and that they were several hundred thousand feet back of their orders at the present writing.
