MERCHANT MARINE.
ITS FIGHTING STRENGTH WOULD BE A POWERFUL AID.

Thirty-one Coastal Cruisers Can Be Added to the United States' Fleet by the Navy Department. - Arrangements of the Auxiliary Ocean Steamer How Many Reached.

In order to meet all the exigencies which would arise a fleet operating on the high seas against an enemy who also possesses a fleet should be composed of vessels of several types, each type possessing special individual qualities which would enable it to perform particular duties. To battle-ship is especially assigned the position of the line of battle. They constitute the main body to make the attack and to meet the defense - that is, the duty of fighting to the finish. For the performance of this duty was also designed, and consequently is being increased, is a part of our main strength in the navy, and, as the New York Herald has pointed out, the one way of doing this duty is to purchase armored ships from foreign nations.

Of unarmored ships our navy, to gather our main strength in, is put to a large number in commission, on a quest upon our being at any time a secondary power. The desire to be performed by cruisers is to destroy commerce and to protect commerce, to ravage the coasts, to act as an "eyes and ears" to the fleet, to keep in touch and in communication with all parts of the fleet and with the base of operations, to form the front, rear and flank of the fleet, and to assist in insuring the efficiency of a blockade. It is certainly difficult to lay down all the above duties in a few words, but in general, the two most essential qualifications to be kept in view in selecting a cruiser are speed and coal capacity.

The chief criterion of speed is the predominating type of ship is evident, whether for war or for peace. There is the only question in how many cruises should there be four to six. A conservative estimate; ten to six is perhaps more. It is only in naval experts hold. What is it with our fleet in the United States?

This special list of coastal cruisers is not a complete list. It is, however, the one presented to congress last year by the chief of the bureau of construction, and it serves as a basis of our present work. The guns called for to be carried on these coastal or auxiliary cruisers amount to forty-four 12 pound 14 gun, twenty-eight 8 inch rapid fire gun, one hundred and four 4 inch rapid fire gun, fifty-four 3 pounder, eight 1 pounder and one hundred and twelve machine guns. At the Washington gun factory the work of preparing the great and the mounds for these guns is now being pushed, but even when complete, it is not until after the first of July that they will have to be put to sea with old cruises.
