BRAINERD WINS TWO GAMES.

The Palace Clothing Co's Ball Team, of Minneapolis, Twice Defeated by The Brainerd Club.

Two very interesting games of ball were played in this city on Saturday and Sunday afternoon between the Brainerd club and the Palace Clothing Company team, of Minneapolis, the aggregation from the Flour City getting two very sound drabbings. Only a small crowd saw the game on Saturday, but Sunday's game was witnessed by nearly 2,000 people. Both games were played on the West Front street grounds. The game on Saturday was not as interesting as the second game, as the regular pitcher of the visiting team was unable to be here to pitch in Saturday's game, and White C. was put into the box for the visitors. He was an easy mark for the Brainerd sluggers who pounded him all over the field. In the fifth inning White W. was substituted, but he was easier yet, and pitched half an inning when White again went into the box. The game was too one-sided to be interesting, the score being 18 to 6 in favor of Brainerd.

Sunday's game was much warmer number and the visitors had the best of it at first. Phyle, of St. Cloud, was in the box for the home team, and Odgaard for the Palace club. Phyle pitched good ball and a winning game until the 7th inning, when he had to retire, and Vorge finished Odgaard pitched good ball for the first five innings, when the home team got onto its feet and touched him up for eleven hits. The fourth inning was disastrous, the visitors making seven runs. The pleasure of the game was marred by the dirty disputatious conduct of Goodman, the second baseman of the visitors, who saw they could not win by fair means and determined to resort to foul. He repeatedly tried to trip base runners, and succeeded in throwing Murphy full length on the ground. This very much incensed Rutherford, who determined to resent and punish any such conduct towards himself.
